TWO CUB CRIPPLES BACK AT WORKOUTS

Noseworthy and Searight
Attend Drills—Prepare for
Tomorrow's Game

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Jerry Searight, big middle wing from Calgary Bronks, and Gordie Noseworthy, schoolboy kicking star, got into heavy harness for the first time in a week and will be used in tomorrow night's exhibition game against Rockland, intermediate Q.R.F.U. team, under the lights at Molson Stadium.

Searight has been out with a groin injury and Noseworthy suffered a dislocated bone in his kicking ankle two weeks ago. The big former West Hill School star unlimbered his leg and was sending hoists of 60 and 65 yards to backfielders, a fact which caused Macdonald's eyes to brighten considerably although certainly no fault could be found with the boot-

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Frank Smith and Roddy Elliott, backfielders from Maine University who did not play Saturday, were not at last night's workout and both were reported suffering from heavy colds which may keep them out of tomorrow night's struggle.

Wigle took over the linebackers last night and wasted no time letting them know that they were the big weakness in Saturday's game. At the same time Macdonald went about improving his forward pass defence, which was woefully weak against the Redmen.

Six men were logged off the squad last night, bringing it down to 35 and three more will be released after the Rockland game.
